# A statement from the creator and choreographer

I created SHE out of a need—a need to challenge myself, and a need for women to be heard and experience a sense of release. Research has shown that movement increases the human sense of vitality, awakening the body and mind and experiencing a renewed energy for life. Movement truly has the ability to heal and therefore free the soul. With the above said, SHE is an artistic form of self-expression to promote healing from violence, rape-culture, and sexual abuse. A year ago four brave women made the decision to step forward to share their stories of sexual violence. They allowed me to turn their stories into narratives and agreed to dance alongside professional dancers. The journey was incredible, and now it continues.

Since SHE's debut, it has been turned it into what I am calling a choreoplay. The story is driven by dance: however a full script I've written accompanies it.

Research, interviews, and personal reflection were all key parts in my creation of the book for SHE.



<u>choreoplay</u>- a dramatic theatrical composition that emphasizes dance and movement to tell a story. Monologues and dialogue between characters are also central elements.

SHE has opened me up to a group of new people, a new sense of self-worth, confidence, and freedom. Together we can empower change.

# THE JINAH PARKER Dance. Choreography. Education. PROJECT

The Jinah Parker Project is a non-profit arts organization created to inspire people of all backgrounds through dance, choreography, and education. Tackling major social issues in America and globally, Jinah views dance as a transformative tool to encourage cultural exchange, courageous conversations, and individual and community action. In short, Jinah's art is for 'the people," and is inspired by everyday people. Her newest major effort in that regard is SHE, a multimedia suite on sexual violence against women and girls, Sandra Bland, and healing.

SHE utilizes dance, spoken word, drama, song, video, live music and a deejay to highlight what the New York Times Magazine has called one of the major human rights issues of the 21st century: gender violence. Housed at New York Live Arts — run by legendary dancer and choreographer Bill T. Jones — SHE was completely sold out at its premiere. SHE is set to embark on a longer run in New York City, and a tour across the United States, including on college campuses.

With SHE, Jinah has created the template for her work going forward, a template which will include performance, conversation, and curriculum. Additionally, Jinah uses an aesthetic she describes as "distorted beauty," which takes classic dance lines and breaks the rules, resulting in crisp and electrifying new movements. That is the vision and mission of The Jinah Parker project: Dance. Choreography. Education.

### Jinah Parker

#### Dancer, Choreographer, Educator

Jinah Parker is a multi-faceted creative force from Buffalo, NY. From a very young age she expressed the gift of dance and choreography, often creating and performing her own dance routines for her parents. Acting as the best audience a kid could have, they placed Jinah in dance classes at the age of four and she has been dancing ever since. Her work is inspired by the tenacity of Debbie Allen and the endless intellectual curiosity of Katherine Dunham.

Since then Jinah has received a Masters Degree in Dance Education from New York University and a B.A. in Dance from the

University at Buffalo where she was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa National Honors Society. Prior to her graduate studies, Jinah was a member of Dayton Contemporary Dance Company II (DCDC2), Lehrerdance, and participated in regional productions of "AIDA" and "Beauty and the Beast." During her studies at NYU, she began working with Alpha Omega Theatrical Dance Company and Annabella Gonzalez Dance Theater. During her work with Alpha Omega Theatrical Dance Company, she has had the honor of performing numerous works by Eleo Pomare and has become a commissioned choreographer for Annabella Gonzalez Dance Theater.

Jinah has worked as a full-time dance educator in both the Buffalo and New York City Board of Education. She has had the pleasure of teaching on the university level as a semester substitute instructor as well as a guest artist. Her specialties lie in modern technique, dance composition, and curriculum writing. Her work has led her to teach and present internationally and she is highly recognized for her expertise around youth choreography.

Jinah's most recent work is her original production SHE that previewed at New York Live Arts and will be presented at HERE Art Center in May 2017; and her dance concert "Statement Pieces" at Dixon Place in New York City. Both productions focused on social themes that affect our society.
